

MATH homework

Second grade families,
Below you will find a brief description of what your child's
MATH homework will look like each evening:

Each night students will bring home a worksheet to complete for homework. This will be ripped out of their math workbook during the school day and placed in their **TAKE HOME FOLDER**. The assignment for the evening will also be written in their **STUDENT PLANNER** (this should be checked nightly). If for any reason students do not have homework on a given night, this will be clearly stated/written in their planner as well. This should eliminate any confusion on homework assignments.

Each homework assignment should be completed by the child independently. The purpose of homework is to reinforce the skills we have already learned & worked on during class. In the case that students may need help on their homework, there is a section at the top titled 'Another Look!' This section gives examples and written instructions as to what we practiced together in class. Use this as a reference.

Another Look! You can count on to find a sum. Counting on from a greater number is easier.

I can add numbers in any order and get the same sum.

$5 + 2 = 7$ $2 + 5 = 7$

HOME ACTIVITY Have your child use small clothing items, such as socks or mittens, to model counting on to find $5 + 4$. Then ask your child to explain why $5 + 4$ and $4 + 5$ have the same sum.

Count on to find the sum. Then change the order of the addends.
